About the Series:

The ICNC Academic Webinar Series is an opportunity for learners across the globe to attend live presentations, lectures, and discussions entirely online. Anyone with an Internet connection or telephone can view and/or listen to the lectures and then ask the presenter questions.

Throughout the year, these hour-long webinars will be offered bi-weekly, typically on Thursdays from 12:00-1:00pm EST. Scholars from across the globe will deliver 30-40 minute power point presentations on topics related to nonviolent conflict such as the core dynamics of civil resistance, backfire action, the role of women in nonviolent struggles, indigenous movements, and democratic sustainability. The presentation will be followed by a 20-30 minute question and answer period. Preliminary readings may also accompany the presentation and will be sent in advance to those who register for the webinar.
