Description:

This three-day professional academic workshop, held on the beautiful campus of Colorado College in the shadow of Pike's Peak, will be an intensive review of teaching and research on strategic nonviolent action as seen today in civic resistance, "people power" and mass nonviolent campaigns in a variety of political and social conflicts.

This three-day professional academic workshop will consider how this subject is being taught in different academic disciplines—such as political science, sociology, international relations, conflict studies, peace studies, strategic studies, and philosophy—at colleges and universities in North America and internationally. The workshop, which will be facilitated by leading scholars of nonviolent conflict, is designed for full professors, junior professors, and ABDs from various faculties and departments who are currently teaching or would like to incorporate some aspect of this subject-matter in their courses or research. The workshop is also meant to help extend and strengthen the growing network of scholars and scholar-practitioners who are interested in these ideas and practices.

Structure:

The workshop will be interactive and participatory. The three-day workshop consists of three thematic modules:

Module 1: **Nonviolent Conflict in the Academy: An Overview**

Module 2: **Transcending Disciplinary Boundaries and Promoting Rigorous Scholarship**

Module 3: **Pedagogical Innovation: Making the Teaching of Nonviolent Struggle as Dynamic as its Reality**

We invite interested applicants to send a CV and a brief (1-2 page) description of their research interests, courses they teach (if applicable) and their motivations for attending People Power and Pedagogy.
